What IS Going On At Mass?

Following the priest's greeting and the people's response at the beginning of Mass, we next share in the Penitential Act—where we recognize that when we encounter God, we must draw near with a pure heart. So, we take a brief moment of silence to call to mind our sins and failings, and we ask the Lord to forgive and heal us. During this part of Mass, as we recall your sins, we might feel unworthy of what is about to be celebrated. Although it may be uncomfortable to think about where we need healing and growth, it is actually a good sign of grace at work in our hearts. We are made for life and communion with God and each other. Sin disrupts and breaks that communion. Sin moves us away from where we belong. The reason we feel frustrated or embarrassed or sad when we think of our sins is that we know deep, down inside that sin is contrary to the life to which God calls us. Hopefully, that discomfort will spur us to seek out the forgiveness of Christ through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

After this brief time of silent reflection, the priest leads the community in praying one of three possible prayers (conveniently known as Form A, B, or C).

Form A—The Confiteor: I confess to Almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefor I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

Form B—The priest says, "Have mercy on us, O Lord," and the people respond, "For we have sinned against you." The priest continues, "Show us, O Lord, your mercy," and the people respond, "And grant us your salvation."

Form C—Three invocations, followed in turn by "Lord, have mercy" / "Christ, have mercy" / and again "Lord, have mercy" are presented by the priest. These invocations, "you came to call sinners" or "you came to heal the contrite of heart" for example, are known as tropes. They never address the Trinity, God, or the Holy Spirit—only Jesus Christ. They focus only on Christ's mission, and the person of Christ.
