

#### Next time you see him, say "hi" to ... Steve Farkaly!

Fr. Glenn loved spending time at the track. He and Stephen (Steve) Farkaly had that in common; Steve even being a card-holding member of the Indy "500" oldtimers group as a Chief Mechanic Engine Builder for 20 years! Steve has gone to the Indy 500 race every year since 1972.



Born in Chicago, Steve attended Blessed Agnes Grade School and Brother Rice High School there. (Blessed Agnes officially became St. Agnes of Bohemia in 1989 and is now the largest Hispanic Parish in the Archdiocese of Chicago.) Steve attended night school at Purdue from the late 70s to the mid-90s - he had to work; he had kids. Steve and his family moved to Indianapolis in 1985/86. They bought a house by St. Christopher, then later moved to the southside between the old St. Ann and St. Joe.

In the mid-1970s, Steve worked as an engine builder for Midway Airport in Chicago, learning how to build airplane engines from someone who had a mentor from the 1930s. After graduating from Purdue, Steve was Senior Project Engineer at Rolls Royce - where jet engines were built - for 5 years, until September 11th. He already had a machine shop where he spent 20 years building race car engines before forced retirement three years ago

when he lost eyesight due to detached retinas in both eyes. He now has to wear sunglasses and can get in about 4-5 hours a day working in his shop. Other health issues with a heart valve and complications from when his lawn mower threw a rock that shattered his leg have taken their toll, but he's feeling better now and can be found at St. Ann weekday masses in addition to 4pm Mass Saturdays.

Steve built race car engines for teams in Indy, which was only viable for the first couple of years until 1984 signaled the end of individual engine builders who were taken over by large corporations. He now enjoys fabricating 1930s-1960s (antique) replica engines for race cars - including turbo Offenhausers and Cosworths - out of original materials, patterns and castings. Steve is a very creative engineer who simply loves to build things. It's an art. He doesn't use a computer or CNC (Computer Numerical Control), as everything he creates is one-of-a-kind that does not make sense to take time programming. Steve learned how to do everything the way it was done in the 40s. A self-described tool and die maker, he used to have actual WWII machines. 100% manual lathes, mills, and welders.

Steve has traveled everywhere racing: England, Australia... and to England with Rolls Royce as well. He's quick to say he had a great wife. "Darlene never complained" despite raising five kids while he was on the road 150 days out of the year working 60-80 hours a week; it was a lifestyle. How did they meet? She called him from Portland, OR to get together next time she was in Chicago (they were from the same neighborhood). Involved in Kart racing with Mario Andretti, Al Unser, and AJ Foyt in the early 80s, he was a celebrity in Chicago at the time, like an MLB player! Steve and wife Darlene belonged to St. Ann. She passed away in 2011 from breast cancer at age 56, thankfully able to receive Last Rites from Fr. Glenn.

Steve, 69, has raised children, now grown and of whom he is very proud, and "a half dozen grandchildren". His oldest stepson has a PhD and is teaching in California. His youngest, twins, have their Masters in Biochemistry. One works at Eli Lilly; the other is in Cambridge, MA working with a chemical startup. His middle daughter has a business degree; she married into a family that works in finance and accounting and has two children. Steve was happy to report that his children visited for Thanksgiving. He likely had many stories to share; more than we had time for, but may have revolved around being a private pilot...
