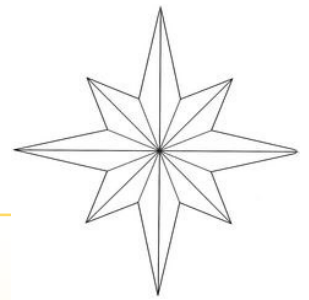

What IS Going On At Mass?

Welcome back, as we return to our Mass Series based on excerpts from Fr. Luke Spannagel's *The Mass Step-By-Step*. Prior to taking a break for Advent and Christmas we had concluded the part of the Mass known as the Introductory Rites, during which the entire congregation stands.

Now, we sit and prepare ourselves to listen (in reverent silence) to God's word. This portion of the Mass, known as the Liturgy of the Word, offers spiritual nourishment through the reading of sacred scripture. But there is more to the Liturgy of the Word than the readings. In a brief outline it includes:

First Reading (usually from the Old Testament)

Responsorial Psalm (sung or recited)

Second Reading (on Sundays and Solemnities—taken from the New Testament outside the Gospels)

The Alleluia/Gospel Acclamation

The Gospel Reading

The Homily

The Profession of Faith

The Prayers of the Faithful

Concluding Prayer

The daily Mass readings are on a two-year cycle with an Old Testament Reading and a Gospel Reading.

The Sunday readings are divided into a three-year cycle. Cycle A focuses on the Gospel according to St. Matthew, Cycle B focuses on St. Mark, and Cycle C focuses on St. Luke. The Old Testament readings correspond to the subject of the Gospel. For example, if the Gospel is about Jesus being persecuted, the First Reading might be about one of the prophets and the conflicts he had with people. Or, if the Gospel is about the Eucharist, the First Reading might be about manna, a sacrifice, or a shared meal.

You might be wondering where the Gospel of St. John is in all of this. St. John's Gospel is used during special times of the Church year like Christmas, Lent, and Easter. It is also used during the summer months of Cycle B, and it usually has a corresponding First Reading from the Old Testament.

The Second Reading for Sunday's and Solemnities is a New Testament reading from outside the Gospels. It does not necessarily relate to the other readings and in general is sequential from one Sunday to the next.

So, there is a structure to the readings. A design carefully planned out to further nourish your spirit. Next Sunday, as you sit in reverent silence listening to the Word of The Lord, focus on the Old Testament Reading and The Gospel Reading.

Can you draw connections between the two?

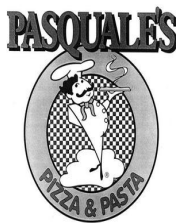
