

What Is Going On At Mass?

Following the proclamation of the Gospel, the priest, bishop or deacon presents his Homily. The word is derived from Greek and means "explanation." Thus the homilist is presenting his explanation of the readings we've just heard. The purpose of this explanation (homily) is to "break open the Scriptures and lead us in a deeper understanding of the mysteries we celebrate." The homily is to be instructive, informal, and intelligent. That is sometimes a tall order!

The homily must be presented by one who has been ordained—a priest, a bishop, or a deacon—never a lay person. This "command" is reserved by those duly ordained to proclaim the Gospel. At ordination, the priest, bishop, or deacon receives the grace of the special purpose of preaching and teaching the Gospels. Although the words may vary to some degree, at one's deaconate ordination rite, the Bishop hands the Book of the Gospels to the deaconate and says, "Receive the Gospel of Christ, whose herald you now are. Believe what you read, teach what you believe, and practice what you teach."

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) teaches, "The Homily is part of the Liturgy...for it is necessary for the nurturing of the Christian Life. It should be an explanation of some aspect of the readings from Sacred Scripture or of another text from the prayers of the Mass and should take into account both the mystery being celebrated and the particular needs of the listeners."

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal further states that there should be a homily at every Sunday and Holy Day Mass when there is a congregation. It is recommended on other days, especially on weekdays of advent, Lent, and the Easter Season, as well as on other "festive days and occasions"" when more people are joining for the celebration.

The Homily further serves as an integral link between the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Recall that before the apostles recognized Jesus in the "Breaking of the bread", Jesus explained the Scriptures to them, "filling their hearts with a burning desire." The Homily strives to kindle a fire of love for God and His Church.

So, our focus should always be on Christ, his love for us, and what that means in our lives. We focus on Christ's four-fold presence to us at every Mass: He is present in the Word of God, in the priest, in his assembled people, and especially in his Body and Blood in the HOLY Eucharist. The liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist together form one single act of worship; the Eucharistic table set for us is the table both of the Word of God and the Body of the Lord. It is important to remem-

ber that the Mass is not just a sequence of unrelated events: it is a perfect unity in Christ. The first half helps us get to know God (and ourselves), nourishing our faith; the second half helps us unite with him in body and soul. The homily, hopefully bridges the two halves together.
