Sacramental information

Anointing of the Sick

For "The Rite of Anointing" **there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament**. A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient. Waiting until near the time of death in many cases is too late. **The priest can only give the sacrament to the living**. In the case of death and the priest is called a blessing can be offered over the body and to the family members. However, it is not then anointing of the sick.

WHO MAY BE ANOINTED?

Baptized members of the Christian faithful who have reached the age of reason and who begin to be in danger due to sickness or old age may receive the sacrament of anointing.

The elderly who are weakened, even though no notable illness is present, may choose to participate in the sacrament. Those who face surgery due to serious illness.

Those who suffer serious mental illness.

"Is anyone among you suffering? He should pray. Is anyone in good spirits? He should sing praise. Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven."

When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing where the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties of serious illness or the frailty of old age.

Personal prayer for those suffering from infirmities and renewed strength:

O Lord, my God, please give me the grace to maintain my hope in you through all of life's changes and to taste and see your goodness. I praise you for the gifts you have showered on me for so many years. Help me find joy in a renewed strength of spirit. Please bless me with good health and inspire me to be a good example to others. For you are Lord, forever and ever. Amen
