What Is Going On At Mass?

As we continue our journey through the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we look more closely at the prayers and the elements used. After the bread and wine are brought forward the priest, either aloud or silently, prays "Blessed are you, Lord God of All creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life." The people respond, "Blessed be God for ever." A similar prayer is prayed when the priest raises the chalice..."fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become for us our spiritual drink." Again, the congregation responds, "Blessed be God for ever". We know these gifts are ultimately from God while being the work of human hands. We bless God for his goodness, and we await the transformation of these gifts into the "bread of life" and our "spiritual drink"—the true presence of Jesus Christ in that host and that wine.

While the priest prepares the wine, he places a small amount of water in the chalice. Why does he do this? The wine represents Christ's divinity and the water represents his (and our) humanity. The mingling of water and wine in the chalice symbolizes the Incarnation of Christ. It also reminds us of Christ's Passion when the soldier pierced his side and out flowed blood and water—signifying the Eucharist and the water of baptism.

This mixing of the water and wine is what we are praying for; joining our humanity with Christ's divinity. We are offering our lives in all of our smallness and weakness to be inseparably joined with the divinity of Christ. As we pray, we become inseparably mingled with God. We are offering our total surrender to become one with Jesus Christ through the consumption of the bread and wine following their consecration.

When you think of "our daily bread" do you think of our staple foods, such as rice and potatoes, or do you think of bread and wine? Bread and wine were common foods for those in the Holy Land during the time of Christ. So common, they were used during the Passover meal. Christ made a choice to use bread and wine at the Last Supper and the Church has remained consistent with that choice making bread and wine "our daily bread". Thus the Church has never felt authorized to modify these elements. Additionally, on the eve of the Passover, unleavened bread was used to commemorate the fleeing of the Hebrews from Egypt and thus the bread we use is unleavened.
