What Is Going On At Mass?

Father has invoked the Holy Spirit and we are now ready for the Consecration. At this moment of the Mass, the priest takes the bread that will become the Body of Jesus and says these words: "Take this all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you." He then takes the wine that will become the Blood of Christ and says, "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of me."

Let us ponder the choice of words.

"Chalice", a very special kind of cup that is reserved for a noble purpose. Indeed, containing the Blood of Christ is that kind of purpose.

The words "poured out" indicate that Christ's Blood, flowing like wine, was completely emptied, expressing his total love for us.

The use of "for you and for many" reveals to us that Christ's new covenant was for those present (the twelve), and for the many not present. His sacrifice was truly for all humanity, yet not all of humanity will accept this saving grace. His Blood was "for you, and for many". This is a stark reminder that salvation through Christ is not completely automatic, but rather a choice each of us must make. He has included each of us, but will each of us include Him?

Following the consecration the priest raises the host and the chalice above the altar in a moment of silence. This elevation is a wonderful moment of prayer and adoration. We are gazing upon Jesus truly with us, and in that moment, we can adore him for all he has done for us: That he would be willing to come and dwell among us. That he would be willing to bear the burden of our sins on the cross so that we could be forgiven. That he loves us so much that he remains with us, until the end of the age, in the Blessed Sacrament. In this brief moment of silence, it might be fitting to pray the words of St. Thomas, "My Lord and my God".

Going even deeper on the moment of elevation. Charles Belmonte explains, "Three things are intended by the elevation of the sacred host: [1] To expose Jesus Christ, now present on the altar, to the adoration of the faithful. [2] To re-present the elevation of Jesus Christ's body on the cross. And [3] To offer to God in silence this one and only Victim of our salvation." Thus, we come to Mass to [1] Adore Christ, present in the Eucharist; [2] to offer Jesus Christ on the cross with the priest and the entire Church and [3] to offer ourselves to God with Jesus Christ as part of the Mystical Body. In other words we come to Mass to unite ourselves with Christ and to share in His sacrifice to the Father.
