**St. Ann Parish** has been given a goal of **\$18,561** for the **UNITED CATHOLIC APPEAL**.

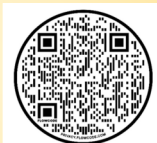
As of 05/21/24 **fifty-six** of **St. Ann's parishioners** have pledged a total of **\$17,651**. This is **95%** of our goal.

## What Is Going On At Mass?

The unblemished sacrificial Victim has been offered up to God in the Holy Spirit. We too have offered up ourselves as we are not spectators of this Mass, but participants. The oblation has now concluded and we continue by offering the prayers of the people. These prayers and petitions are also known as the intercessions as we are reaching out to God on behalf of others.

We pray for the pope, the bishop and all the clergy.

Intercession is also made on behalf of the entire Church, both those who are present at the Mass and those throughout the world.—Eucharistic Prayer II: “Remember, Lord, your Church, spread throughout the world, and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with Francis our Pope and Charles our Bishop and all the clergy.”

We pray for the faithful departed; that they be taken to Heaven and live in the presence of God. Eucharistic Prayer IV—“Remember also those who have died in the peace of your Christ and all the dead, whose faith you alone have known.” In all Masses, the Church prays for the dead, so that on the basis of the communion existing among all of us as members in Christ, our petition for spiritual help may bring comforting hope for us and our faithful departed.

We then direct our prayer request to those already in the presence of God. What better way to express our unity than to ask the saints in heaven to intercede for us.—Eucharistic Prayer III: “May He make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with Blessed Joseph her Spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs, and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailling help”.

Thus you can see that the intercessions are generally divided into three sections—for living Christians, for the dearly departed, and in relation to the saints in heaven (what is, what was, and what is to be).

We petition that God hears our prayers as we offer them through the Mass. We ask for His mercy and we also pray that we be united, so we may worship as one body, fulfilling the desire of our Lord Himself.

This unity is strengthened as we first pray for our church and civic leaders. We ask that they properly guide and unite us to the will of God. Each Mass presupposes union among the faithful, and union of the faithful with their bishop, the pope, and the universal Church. Moreover, that solid union is made stronger with the celebration of the Eucharist and is indeed a consequence of that celebration.
