What Is Going On At Mass?

The priest has completed the consecration, but before we move on let us examine how the consecration works. For this, we turn to our Catechism for some helpful wisdom. "It is by the conversion of the bread and wine into Christ's body and blood that Christ becomes present in this sacrament. The Church Fathers strongly affirmed the faith of the Church in the efficacy of the Word of Christ and of the action of the Holy Spirit to bring about this conversion. Thus St. John Chrysostom declares: 'It is not man that causes the things offered to become the Body and Blood of Christ, but Christ himself—he who was crucified for us. The priest, in the role of Christ, pronounces these words, but their power and grace are God's. The *Catechism* tells us that the word of Jesus is what changes the bread and wine into his Body and Blood.

But some may say, the host still 'looks' the same!" St. Cyril of Jerusalem (314–386) teaches, "Do not think these are just plain bread and plain wine. They are the body and blood of Christ, as the Lord asserted. Faith must convince you of the latter even though your senses suggest to you the former. Do not judge about this according to your preferences but, based on your faith, believe with firmness and certainty that you have been made worthy of the body and blood of Christ" (*Understanding the Mass*, pp. 140–141). If your faith feels unsure, ask the Lord to help you see with the eyes of faith that he is truly there. Let the genuflections and reverence from your body help remind your mind of what we believe is true. Let the model of faith from the saints and the martyrs inspire you. Let our hearts be filled with joy after the consecration, and let us rejoice in recalling that Jesus is sacramentally present. Let us shout with joy the words of St. John, "It is the Lord!" (*John 21:7*).

Now that Jesus is truly present on the altar and we have adored him quietly, what else should we do but raise our voices and proclaim our joy out loud? After the elevation of the chalice, the priest genuflects in adoration. When he rises, he says, "the mystery of faith." These words invite one of three responses:

1. "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again?;
2. "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim you Death, o Lord, until you come again";
3. "Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free."

This portion of the Mass is known as the Anamnesis or the Memorial Acclamation. It is a prayer of remembrance in which the Church calls to mind the Lord's passion, resurrection, and ascension into heaven. This **IS** the mystery of our faith. Precisely, the redeeming sacrifice of Christ, celebrated in these rites, at every Mass.
