

ST ANN PASTORAL COUNCIL MINUTES
OF MAY 29, 2019

Meeting was called to order by Vice President John Cobb at 7:04 P.M. with a Hail Mary. Present at that time were Amanda Gilliland, Jane Gilliam, Ken Betz, Carolyn Gornick, Kathy Byrd, Keith Fournier, John Cobb, Fr. Rob Hausladen, Mike Cesnik and Jackie Cesnik. Ryan Wunderlich arrived a bit later. Not present were Jose Cruz, Chad Swain and Shauna Cooper. The minutes of the April 30, 2019 meeting were approved as written.

OPENING REMARKS

Carolyn Gornick reported that she went to Trophy House to look at sizes and prices for plaques to designate "Father Glenn O'Connor Hall." She recommended the 6 1/2" by 18" size plaques in the same style as the plaque over the door of the Jane Shireman Room. The cost is \$65 for each plaque. The plaques are to be placed over the two interior entrance doors to the hall. Carolyn also requested that we have a small dedication ceremony after the plaques are made, (in about 2 weeks). A vote was taken and the Council approved the purchase of the plaques and the placements in the social hall.

ADMINISTRATION

Ken Betz reported that there was a meeting with the ADLF Committee on May 15. Mike McKay reviewed income and expense highlights for the first 9 months of this fiscal year. Mike will submit invoices for startup expenses for the Pre-School for reimbursement via the grant award. Fr. Rob explained that preschool enrollment is currently around 12-13, which is below break-even. We are increasing advertising with a goal to increase enrollment. Tom Barnes explained that the softball fields are for both parishioner use and expected to be income producing. The ADLF committee complimented our progress. Drain pipe from back fields into the retention pond has been repaired. Drains from retention pond to sewer is pending a response from ATT. The pipe was damaged when their optic fiber cables were installed. Our barn was broken into on Saturday, May 11. The doors and the building were damaged and equipment was stolen. Insurance will cover the cost of replacement minus \$5,000 deductible. We are receiving donations of labor for repairs and some equipment. Additional security measures are being implemented. Regarding yard, building and road damage from the cell tower upgrade--we are still in negotiations with all stakeholders. The first meeting of the Festival Committee will be on June 13. We already have our festival license. John Cobb has been working with the printers to get the raffle tickets printed. Flanner and Buchanan and McDonald's are paying for the tickets to be printed. Rhonda Gerding hopes to get the sponsorship sheets in the bulletin yet this week.

During the Council meeting there was a discussion on where to put the children's games and items for the silent auction during the Festival. The possibility of having a

second tent was brought up. Fr. Rob suggested that we might borrow a tent from St. Joseph parish, then return it in time for St. Joe's festival. That matter was deferred to the Festival Committee when it will meet on June 13.

STEWARDSHIP

Jackie Cesnik reported that 21 persons came to the "Wine and Cheese Appreciation" for parish leaders. She considered it to be a success. Jackie also reported that tours of the church will again be offered during the parish festival.

FAMILY LIFE

Kathy Byrd reported that she did not receive a report from the Giving Tree, the Men's Club, St. Vincent de Paul or the Friendship Project. There were no funeral dinners to report. Young @ Heart met on Thursday, May 23 at Pasquale's. 13 attended. Pro Life helped a mom with some rent needs again this past month. The program on Coping With Major Illness and Grief as Catholics is set for 10/13/19. The Ladies Guild will be putting together pill packets in August for Barb Winningham's mission trip. At the May meeting Prayer Partners were revealed and new partners were picked. High chairs have been ordered with the proceeds from the Easter weekend bake sale and some of the proceeds are left.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

Rose Slocum said there were no meetings and nothing to report.

OLD BUSINESS

Fr. Rob explained that there were only two eligible individuals who accepted nomination to fill the two open Council seats. Thus there is no need for a parish election for the Parish Council. The two eligible nominees will assume their positions. Amanda Gilliland will continue on the Council. Keith Fournier will inform Theresa Tetrick that she can join the Council in June. All Council members are reminded that they must complete "Safe and Sacred."

NEW BUSINESS

Acts and Snacks will take place on June 15. John Cobb volunteered to provide donuts for Coffee and Donuts on June 23. Plans need to be made for the welcoming of our new pastor, Father Francis Joseph, in July. A discussion took place on whether funds from the 50/50 should continue going into the general parish fund, or whether they should be designated for a particular parish need. Council decided that the funds from 50/50 will be designated for the Pre-School. Ken Betz volunteered to put this announcement in the parish bulletin. Fr. Rob said he would get back with the Council regarding a date for his going away event. Next Council meeting will be on June 25.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:24 PM with the St. Ann Prayer.
