## What Is Going On At Mass?

“Let us pray.”

Following Holy Communion and our time for prayer, we prepare to go forth into the world. This is called the Prayer after Communion. As the General Instruction of the Roman Missal says, “To bring to completion the prayer of the People of God, and also to conclude the whole Communion Rite, the Priest pronounces the Prayer after Communion, in which he prays for the fruits of the mystery just celebrated. The people make the prayer their own by means of the acclamation Amen” (GIRM, 89). Oftentimes this Prayer beseeches God to put the graces received in the Eucharist into practice, and to bring the celebration to fulfillment in Heaven. This prayer often indicates our mission in the world as disciples of Christ.

This prayer can often be short and quick; although to miss it is truly to miss something wonderful. Consider the following Prayers after Communion from the Solemnities of our Lord during Ordinary Time:

- (1) The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: “Grant, O Lord, we pray, that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood. Who live and reign for ever and ever.”
- (2) The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: “May this sacrament of charity, O Lord, make us fervent with the fire of holy love, so that, drawn always to your Son, we may learn to see him in our neighbor. Through Christ our Lord.”
- (3) Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe: “Having received the food of immortality, we ask, O Lord, that, glorying in obedience to the commands of Christ, the King of the universe, we may live with him eternally in his heavenly Kingdom. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever.”

These examples give us a good idea of what we are praying at this part of the Mass. We are recalling the amazing gift we have received. We are asking that the fruits of Jesus truly present will strengthen us in his love as we go out into the world. We are looking toward sharing the fullness of life with our loving Lord in the Kingdom of Heaven.

The Prayer after Communion actually helps very well to pull together what we have heard, said, and done at the Mass. We can profit a lot from the prayer by using it as an inspiration for personal reflection during the course of the day.

Being honest with ourselves, we know that sometimes at this point in the Mass we are looking ahead to what is next, perhaps a nice family meal or enjoying the big game. The Prayer after Communion, however, reminds us that the fruits of the Mass do not just take place within the church walls—they also happen in our minds and hearts. As we get ready to go forth, hopefully we have been strengthened with resolve for faithfulness. Hopefully, our hearts have become more like the One who loves us best.

So, Instead of thinking past this moment in the Mass to your exit plan from the parking lot, why not use it as an opportunity to put everything together and really prepare to go out into the world as a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ. If we do this, we won't as easily forget the great graces we have received at the Holy Mass. Instead, we will actively carry them with us throughout the day—and even better—share them with others?

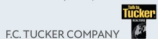

Next time you see him, say "hi" to ... Steve Kavanaugh

A good-natured guy who takes Fr. Jude's ribbing in stride, Steve Kavanaugh has been a member of St. Ann parish for 34 years. You may know him from volunteering at the track - which he did for 28/29 years, heading festival parking over the past 14 years, or handling security at 4pm Mass. Maybe you've seen him mowing, a role Fr. Glenn "tricked him into". No one else would take the keys so finally Steve relented and went from being co-chair to chair, now managing, but not micro-managing, four mowing crews. Steve is quick to note the captains govern themselves, making their own decisions about when and how to mow. "They are grown people and used to running their own lives" He is proud to look over the freshly mowed grass when finished and notes your compliments on the grounds.

Steve grew up in southern Indiana/Davis County among Amish and Mennonite families. He was #9 of 10 children. His family recently received the Hoosier Historian Award for their 86-acre farm in southern Indiana that has been in the family for five generations now. For someone who can spend 16 hours a day on a tractor and loves to work with soil, moving to the city was not what Steve wanted, but if you didn't inherit land it was too expensive to purchase. He graduated from Barr-Reeve in 1971, took classes at ITT, and went on to work at GM for 34 years. He was inducted into the Indiana Metro Softball Hall of Fame in 1995 after playing AA amateur softball fast pitch for 18 years, well into his 40s. Steve still helps out on the family farm. He donates double red blood cells for cancer and trauma patients, having lost two brothers to cancer.

Steve considers St. Ann a parish family. He has tremendous respect for the people he's worked with over the years. Speaking of years, if you happen see Steve Thursday, October 17th, wish him a Happy (72nd) Birthday!
