## What Is Going On At Mass?

Strengthened by the true presence of Jesus and following the Prayer after Communion, we are truly ready to go out into the world. However, before we head to our cars we await the Concluding Rites. As The General Instruction of the Roman Missal lays out, "To the Concluding Rites belong the following: (a) brief announcements, should they be necessary; (b) the Priest's Greeting and Blessing, which on certain days and occasions is expanded and expressed by the Prayer over the People or another more solemn formula; (c) the Dismissal of the people by the Deacon or the Priest, so that each may go back to doing good works, praising and blessing God; (d) the kissing of the altar by the Priest and the Deacon, followed by a profound bow to the altar by the Priest, the Deacon, and the other ministers" (GIRM, 90).

Many of these parts mirror what we did at the very beginning of Mass, including the priest's greeting and response from the people: "The Lord be with you." "And with your spirit." The celebrant then blesses the people assembled. Sometimes, the blessing is very simple. On special days, the blessing may be more extensive. In every case, the blessing is always trinitarian: "May almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit." With these words, all assembled make the sign of the cross. It is in the triune God and in the Sign of The Cross that we find our true blessing (USCCB).

After this blessing, the deacon dismisses the people with one of the following:

"Go forth, the Mass is ended."

"Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord."

"Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life."

To any of these, the people respond: "Thanks be to God."

You will notice that each of these begins with "Go".

Each option of the dismissal is actually an instruction telling us what to do next—"Go"—and spread the good news of the Gospel.

The dismissal, in fact, gives the entire liturgy its name. At one time, the people were dismissed with the words "Ite, Missa est" (literally meaning "Go, you are sent"). The word "Mass" comes from the Latin word, "missa." The word "Missa" is related to the word "missio," the root of the English word "mission." The liturgy does not simply come to an end, rather those assembled are sent forth on the mission to bring the fruits of the Eucharist to the world. As the Catechism explains, the celebration of the Eucharist is called "Holy Mass" (Missa) because the liturgy in which the mystery of salvation is accomplished concludes with the sending forth (mission) of the faithful, so that they may fulfill God's will in their lives" (a Biblical Walk Through the Mass, pp. 147-8; CCC, 1332)

As Jesus told the apostles, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21).

The next time you are leaving Mass, think joyfully of all the fruits of that Mass and ask yourself: How can I share these fruits with the people I encounter?

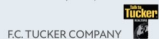

Next time you see her, say hi to... Lucy (Luz) Castaneda!



Most of us would think four children, being a very involved mom, and working full time was busy. Not Lucy! Mary Ann from STM had asked Lucy for months to come and work at St. Ann. Lucy even turned down Fr. Jude's request to do so. Finally, she knew she wanted to share her time and talent and God insisted, "You have time." As Coordinator of Faith Formation, Lucy loves Religious Ed, the Christmas Pageant, OCIA... and is "forever grateful" to Mike McKay and Linda Routon for their support when she was hired. Lucy loves working with Fr. Jude and spoke very highly of Cindy Barnes who prepares the little ones so well!

Luz (Lucy) and her husband Geronimo (Jerry) had been St. Anthony parishioners for almost 18 years before coming to St. Ann. They were happy when riding home after their first St. Ann Mass, their boys, whose primary language is English, exclaimed, "Did you hear them say this?!" all the way home. The boys had never talked about what they heard after St. Anthony masses in Spanish, but now did so every trip home. The third visit to St. Ann, this time by herself, Lucy was surprised when Fr. Jude recognized her and asked, "Where's the gang?." "Everyone was so welcoming!" Now her husband, who is Hispanic and Mexican, attends Mass every Sunday and has been very involved since Lucy started working at St. Ann.

Daughter Adamarie (26) who lives in Tampa and has three children: Messiah (7), Navaya (2 on 10/20), and Layla (born 6/6/24); sons Josh (21), Nicolas (almost 19) and Sebastian (17) are "my biggest blessing and very smart for their age". Luz has worked for Apria Healthcare 23 years, most recently from home which has allowed her to be with her boys before and after school.

Lucy and her husband have Date Night every Friday. With her boundless energy, Lucy is always looking for somewhere to go; she and Jerry venture out all the time, including dancing to Spanish (like country) music. You might catch her in her boots of an evening! She enjoys exploring different walking trails and loves cooking. Worried about her daughter in Tampa with the recent hurricanes, she "stress-cooked" multiple courses including boiled shrimp, a chocolate cake, pie for the boys... for which a neighbor who is sometimes too tired to cook appreciated!

The Castanedas have lived here 21 years. There are many Hispanics in our area, notes Lucy, but many choose parishes that offer Spanish Mass. She would like to see a monthly bilingual Mass at St. Ann. Bringing people together, including French in addition to Spanish, is better at first than having a separate Spanish Mass. "We need to learn how to work together before we get separated."

Lucy has no problem finding volunteers. It's leading ministries that poses the challenge. Fr. John at St. Anthony always said to try and find your replacement. Lucy guided Our Lady of Guadalupe ministry for 8 years, then the festival for 6 years, and tried funeral and condolences (she offered to bring food as an alternative to her everflowing tears this ministry evoked). Bringing in new people to lead is so important! The leaders then go on to volunteer in another capacity after a few years. Gains, not losses.

Next time you say hi to Lucy and Jerry, pleasantly surprise them by calling them Luz and Geronimo! You will find Luz in the front row at Mass.
