What Is Going On At Mass?

Following the Deacon's dismissal "Go Forth, the Mass has ended", the priest goes to the altar once more and reverences it with a kiss. The Mass "ends" where it began—at the altar. "For on the altar the sacrifice of Christ was made present in our midst. As the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, the altar on which this sacrifice is rendered is given this gesture of reverence and even love. A kiss is a symbol of love—the priest, the servant of God and minister to the Holy of Holies, acknowledges his love for the mystery that he celebrates. As it is the source and summit of the Church, it is then necessarily the source and summit of the priest's ministry in the parish. Everything in the Church derives from and is pointed toward the Most Holy Eucharist (A Study of the Mass, p. 20). Just as we saw in the entrance at the beginning of Mass, the altar is especially honored as the place where Jesus truly becomes present during the Mass.

"After reverencing the altar the priest genuflects in adoration of the Blessed Sacrament before exiting the sanctuary. The priest then recesses, most often following the cross and candles that led him in. The recessional may be accompanied by a hymn of praise, or even just instrumental music. The music at this point is typically majestic, as we have concluded the celebration of a most majestic event" (A Study of the Mass, p. 21). Some priests have pointed out that there is not a recessional antiphon in the Roman Missal, whereas we do have Entrance and Communion Antiphons. These antiphons unite us in praise and meditation, while the conclusion of Mass feels more open-ended. Perhaps this is fitting, in accordance with mission and sending forth; perhaps this open-ended conclusion reminds us that the fruits of the Mass continue and are carried forth with us as we depart. Within that mindset, singing together also feels appropriate, as we are now going forth together, united by Christ!

As the celebrant follows the processional cross out of church, we are reminded that "it is not appropriate to leave or exit the church before the priest, as the symbolism is so important. Following the cross 'into the world' is a profound thing that all of us do, even if not immediately after the priest. We carry the cross of the Lord with us as it was 'by his Holy Cross you have redeemed the world!' The Cross is the most powerful symbol of God's love for his people. God so loved the world that He sent His only son so that we might not die, but have eternal life! In Catholic churches we have a corpus of Christ on our processional crucifixes and sanctuary crucifixes because the Paschal Mystery is at the center of all our celebrations. When we look upon the crucifix we see our God, who literally loves us to death! We carry this love with us into the world, as all of us are 'missionaries' given a mission to spread the 'Good News' of our Lord Jesus Christ" (A Study of the Mass, p 21).

Let us then remember this love as we "process" out into the world. Let us take with us what we have learned about God and about ourselves; let us take the graces we have received; let us take the victory of the Cross which we have experienced and process out into the world. That is how the fruits of the victory of the Cross are extended to every heart; that is how the fruits of the Mass are extended to all people! That is how we embrace our identity as Eucharistic Missionaries!

Next time you see him, say hi to... Robert McKay!



"Happy to help!" embodies Robert's overall attitude and how he gratuitously responded to being featured, despite having his hands full, being on Fall Break, and headed out the door. Robert McKay, the youngest of five kids (2 girls and 3 boys), grew up in the Southport area, attending St. Jude and Roncalli. Now in his 4th/final year at Bishop Simon Brute Seminary, Robert is busy with Marian University classes toward an undergrad degree in Philosophy as well as many masses, prayer services, meetings and more. The 1st four years focus on "developing us as Catholic men and discerning whether we are called to the priesthood." The 2nd four years at St. Meinrad, Robert will take classes in Theology. At this point, "guys are generally much more sure that they are called to the priesthood, and so this time is spent more on developing ourselves for the vocation and all it entails."

Robert first heard the call to the priesthood during 8th Grade Confirmation classes where "we were learning about various aspects of the faith and spending time with people who a) knew a ton about the faith and b) loved the faith. Through those classes, I came to see the joy and peace that Catholic life brought to people, so I began to live out my faith more intentionally. Around that time, I was also beginning to think about what I was going to do with my future, and I realized that I would love to help instill the faith in other people, so they could feel that joy and peace too."

Spending time with St. Ann priests like Fr. Glenn, Fr. Rob, Fr. Francis and now Fr. Jude; seeing them in their day-to-day vocations at Mass, in the office, at festivals, etc. when dad (Mike) dragged him to work all the time, was a "huge" influence on Robert's decision to become a priest. "Through them, I see the joy that comes with ministry, and I also know that there is not just one type of man that God calls to the priesthood. He calls many types of men, who can glorify His Name in different ways."

When asked how parents/caregivers can help their children develop a strong Catholic faith foundation and continue to grow spiritually, Robert responded "Pray with your kids and encourage them to think about their vocation, i.e. where God is calling them in their life. It is the duty of every young Catholic man and woman to consider if the priesthood or religious life is right for them, respectively. Of course, not everyone is called to those paths, but we should all be willing to at least ask God if He wants that for us." As a parish priest, Robert would want to offer "spiritual fatherhood - an open ear, a willingness to guide them amidst the troubles we experience, someone to come to for advice, a deep sense of love for my congregation. Someone who brings God to them and them to God."

Robert loves listening to music, reading, talking/messing around with guys at Brute, learning new languages - currently Spanish and American Sign Language - and visiting St. Ann on breaks, a place that feels like home. "I've grown up here." His family has had weddings, funerals, baptisms, confirmations, and more at St. Ann. "I feel cherished and welcome here. Know of my prayers for you all, and please pray for me." We will and hope you enjoyed camping and spending time with your family over Fall Break!
