The reality is that abortion doesn't just impact a woman's life; it ends a child's life. It forever changes the lives of everyone it touches, including women, men, extended family members, friends, and our communities.

All are welcome to join us for this Pro-Life Lecture on Friday, November 15. Most people do not realize that sometimes abortion procedures fail, are stopped, or reversed (abortion pill), and survivors exist. Come hear Melissa Ohden share her story as an abortion survivor and pro-life speaker.

In 1977, Melissa's biological mother was a 19 year old college student when she had a saline infusion abortion that was meant to end Melissa's life. Although her biological mother thought that she was less than five months pregnant when she had the abortion, the fact that Melissa survived and weighed almost 3 pounds indicates that her biological mother was much further along in her pregnancy than she realized.

# **Bobby Kloska to address Catholic Business Exchange**



Robert "Bobby" Kloska, Chief Partnership Officer of the Notre Dame Federal Credit Union and proprietor of St. Peter's Pub at the University, will speak at the November Catholic Business Exchange. The title of his talk is: "Faith Through the Fight: My Journey with Cancer".

Since 2003, he has experienced three separate occurrences of cancer which have led to chemotherapy, radiation, two stem cell transplants, 30+ surgeries, a heart attack, three coronary stents, two incurable viruses, chronic blood issues, and countless hospitalizations and outpatient IV treatments. In 2014, Bobby was hired at Notre Dame Federal Credit Union to help develop and implement the CEO's vision for a national Catholic financial ecosystem. Today, Notre Dame FCU has contributed to the well-being of three dozen dioceses nation-wide, funding Catholic radio stations, schools, and parishes. Among his many other accomplishments, he might be most notably known as the proprietor of St. Peter's Pub, a 110-year-old backyard carriage house w has been converted into a Catholic friendly social hub for the university community, along with neighbors, family and friends

The event is November 15, at the Northside Events and Social Club. Mass is offered at 7am and the program will be finished by 9am. 
