What Is Going On At Mass?

Recalling from last week, we brought our meager gifts of bread and wine to the altar to ultimately be returned to us in an awe-inspiring gift...the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. Before the "return of our gifts" a few things will happen. The priest after receiving the gifts continues by washing his hands over a dish called a lavabo (which means, "I shall wash"). In earlier times, in addition to bread and wine, the people brought gifts of various kinds of produce and livestock to feed the poor. The practice of washing hands came from these very practical roots. The priest, after touching these gifts, washed his hands before touching the body of Christ. We look now more at the need to cleanse ourselves internally. As the priest washes his hands, he prays, "Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin". This prayer is prayed quietly by the priest. However, it is a good time for us to ask God to purify us in mind and heart as we prepare to receive the "True Presence of Christ at the altar".

After the priest washes his hands we are given yet another opportunity to bond with the sacrifice of Christ. With outstretched hands, the priest invites his gathered flock—"Pray, brethren, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father". The congregation stands and professes, "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church".

Notice that the priest begs us to unite ourselves with him ("my sacrifice and yours") in the sacrificial act as it draws nearer. Thus the sacrifice of the Mass is not offered by the priest alone, but by all of us. By virtue of our baptism we are all called to offer (sacrifice) ourselves to the Father through Christ.

The priest specifies that the sacrifice is "mine"—this is an act of his "ministerial priesthood", an authority bestowed at the priest's ordination. He further specifies that the sacrifice is "yours", meaning the congregation's, as members of the "common priesthood" bestowed at our baptism when we were anointed "priest, prophet and king". Did you know you belonged to the "common priesthood"?

Throughout the prayers during the offertory, we are invited to unite ourselves with Jesus through his sacrifice and ours. We know the prayer responses. To truly be ready to receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord, we need to be present during these prayers; not just responding as robots. But rather, by placing ourselves in the conscious presence of His sacrifice. The total sacrifice of Himself, that he made for each of us—for you and for me.
