What Is Going On At Mass?

We continue our journey through the Mass, looking more deeply into the Rite of Peace.

The Church, insofar as She is the Bride of Christ, is holy and without blemish. While the Church remains holy, Her members are prone to sin and error, and so we beseech our Lord to look upon His Church with favor and grant us the peace and unity of the kingdom of heaven. Upon asking our Lord for this peace, the priest extends such peace to the congregation as he says: "The peace of the Lord be with you always!" The people reply: "And with your spirit." The deacon or priest then says: "Let us offer each other the sign of peace."

According to local custom, we exchange with one another a sign of peace such as a handshake. Certainly, spouses, families, and others may have more intimate exchanges such as a hug or a kiss. During times when people are being more cautious about illness and contact, a simple bow or a wave and a smile can be fine gestures of peace as well. Generally, people are encouraged to choose the sign that is comfortable for themselves and the people around them. The main thing we want to remember is to make the gesture a real sign of peace, while at the same time not being too carefree or moving throughout the church, where we might risk being disrespectful to Jesus present on the altar (which is also why we should not have conversations at this time). This should not be an elaborate exchange, however, according to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, "it is appropriate that each person, in a somber manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest."

There are no ritual words to be said during the sign of peace, but some prefer to say: "Peace be with you" or "the Peace of Christ be with your" or "God bless you." The response may be equally simple. This shared gesture is a sign of recognition of fellowship, of respect, of friendship and is essentially a sign of reconciliation expressing the mutual regard of Christian for Christian. St. Paul recognized this sign of peace as an expression of Christian community (Rom 16:16), and St. Peter considered this greeting a sign of union with Christ, or Christ-like togetherness (1 Pt 5:14). This exchange of peace acknowledges forgiveness, humility and community. In Matthew, Chapter 5, our Lord taught us we must first be reconciled with one another before approaching the altar. We approach the altar to receive the Prince of Peace; His command is that we be peacemakers ourselves by forgiving others and asking pardon for our sins. It is also a gesture of communal Spirit which resides in the Church. The gesture of peace signifies the "ecclesial bond" that with Christ we are a community of believers and children of the same Father" (A Study of the Mass, p.18).

The next time you offer the Sign of Peace at Mass, whether a hug, a kiss, a handshake, a simple bow, a wave, or a smile, think about what it truly means—what you truly want to offer to those around you—and how it helps prepare your heart for Jesus truly present in Holy Communion.
