## What Is Going On At Mass?

As the singing of the “Lamb of God” is concluded, the faithful kneel down in adoration of THE Lamb of God present on the altar—Jesus Christ really, truly, and substantially present. Meanwhile, the priest joins his hands, perhaps bowing slightly, speaks quietly to himself, genuflects, and then gets ready for the next part of the Mass. It looks as though he is talking to himself, but actually, he is praying!

There are several times during the Mass when one can see the priest praying quietly. Usually these prayers are for the church or the faithful present at the Mass. This, however, is the one time during the Mass that the priest prays solely for himself.

This portion of the Mass is called the “**private preparation of the priest**”. As is often the case, the name of this part of the Mass tells you exactly what is happening. After the fraction rite, the priest prays a prayer quietly to himself in preparation to receive Our Lord. This is done quietly because it is a personal prayer of the priest as he prepares himself for communion. The sacrament of the Eucharist is the only Sacrament a priest can administer to himself. This private prayer asks the Lord to forgive any faults and to keep him faithful to the teachings of the Church. After his private preparation, the priest genuflects in adoration.

The Roman Missal actually gives the priest two options for this private prayer, both equally beautiful and prayerful: [1] “Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who, by the will of the Father and the work of the Holy Spirit, through your Death gave life to the world, free me by this, your most holy Body and Blood, from all my sins and from every evil; keep me always faithful to your commandments, and never let me be parted from you.

Or

[2] May the receiving of your Body and Blood, Lord Jesus Christ, not bring me to judgment and condemnation, but through your loving mercy be for me protection in mind and body and a healing remedy.

The personal preparation of the priest gives us the opportunity to prepare ourselves as well. In silence, without the noise of words, we too should be asking for God’s protection and healing.

We feel unworthy as the moment for receiving our Lord approaches. But we know that He wants to remain in the consecrated species to be our nourishment and the cure for our weaknesses. In a way similar to the priest’s preparation, this is a wonderful moment to ask Jesus to strengthen us in faithfulness and purity through the gift of Holy Communion. Let us prepare fervently at this part of the Mass, for the Lord is coming to us very soon in Flesh and Blood—The Most Holy Eucharist!
